# **Polycythemia Vera**



Polycythemia Vera is a lowgrowing type of blood cancer in which the bone marrow makes too many red blood cells. It usually

develops slowly, and you may have it for years without noticing signs or symptoms.

#### Causes

Polycythemia Vera occurs when:

A mutation in bone marrow cells happens It causes a Problem with blood cell production Bone marrow makes too many of some blood cells

# **Symptoms**



itchiness

headache





dizziness

weakness





excessive sweating

painful swelling of the joint, often big toe





shortness of breath breathing difficulty when you lie down



numbness, burning, or weakness in hands



#### **Risk factors**

Age: more common in adults older than 60

## **Complications**

#### blood clots

 Polycythemia Vera causes the blood to be thicker than normal.

# Enlarged spleen

 The increased number of blood cells caused by Polycythemia Vera makes the spleen work harder than normal, which causes to enlarge.

## Skin problems

 May cause the skin to itch, after warm bath or shower or after sleeping in a warm bed. Skin may also appear red, especially on the face.

## **Test and diagnostics**

- Blood test: CBCD
- Bone marrow aspiration and biopsy

### **Treatment and drugs**

- Phlebotomy (Blood Letting). The goal
  Phlebotomy is to keep the hematocrit around
  45% in men and 42% in women.
- Hydroxyurea. It can lower all elevated blood counts (WBC, RBC and Platelet. This is especially advised in people at risk of clot formation.
- Aspirin. To lower the risk of clotting. It is usually used in conjunction with Phlebotomy.



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
