




**Promote Culture of Safety to Prevent Sharps Injuries** 

#### **Sharps Injuries**


Are serious hazard in any health care settings

Contact with **contaminated needle**, scalpels, broken glass and other sharps may expose **health care workers** to **blood/body fluids** that contain **blood borne pathogens** which may put your life in danger.

# How do I prevent myself from sharp injuries?



Organize your work area with appropriate sharps disposal container within reach

Work in well-lit areas

Receive training on how to use sharps safety devices

Keep the exposed sharp in view

Before handling sharps, assess any hazards – get help if needed

# How do I prevent myself from sharp injuries?



Avoid hand passing sharps and use verbal alerts when moving sharps

Be aware of people around you

Watch for sharps in linen, beds, on the floor, or in waste containers

Stop if you feel rushed or distracted

Close and change sharp container when 2/3 full and between used close the lid

# How do I manage needle stick, sharp Injury& Body Fluid Exposure?

In case of an Injury with a used needle or other sharp or if blood/body fluid splashed into mouth, eyes or onto broken skin, carry out the following:



Needle prick/cuts/bites/scra tches

**Wash** thoroughly with soap and water

**Cover** with a waterproof dressing



Splashes to mouth/eyes/broken skin

**Rinse** thoroughly with plenty of running water

- 1) Inform your manager immediately.
- 2) Identify the patient you exposed to his/her sharp item or body fluid then send blood sample for Serology under Needle stick Injury tab in the cortex.
- 3) Fill up the Needle stick/Sharp/Body
  fluid exposure E-form (available in
  the Intranet→ E-form #108
  Occupational Hazard Needle
  Puncture and Sharp Instruments Injuries among
  Employees)
- 4) Go to Employee Health Department immediately during working hours (0730h-1630h) or to main Emergency Department during weekend & after working hours (1630h-0730h).
- 5) Complete the event reporting form (DATIX)
